Drs. Ramanan Establish Endowed Symposium Fund for Primary Care

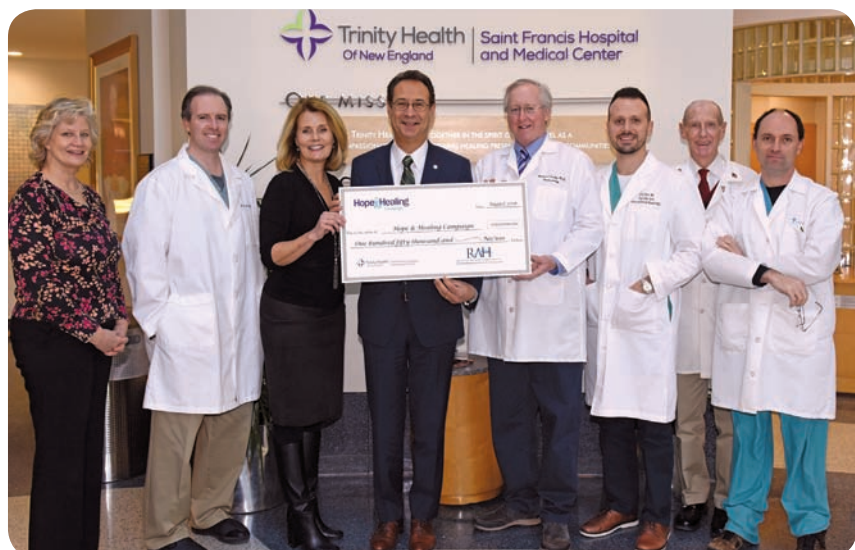

Their journey to Hartford took them from Sri Lanka through India, to London, a few years in West Virginia and ultimately, Connecticut. In 2011, RAH partnered with Saint Francis to establish a free mammography day in October, in recognition of Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Since establishing that program more than 500 women have been screened for breast cancer. The team at RAH is focused on the welfare of the patients in our community and their support is sewn into the fabric of all that happens at Saint Francis.

One of the highlights of the evening will be the presentation of two LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS to honor and celebrate the careers of two Saint Francis legends, **Dr. Surendra Chawla** and **Dr. Robert Jeresaty**.

Dr. Robert M. Jeresaty

In 1958, Robert Jeresaty, MD arrived at Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center for a one-year medical residency and found his forever home. He graduated Valedictorian from Saint Joseph University, Beirut, Lebanon and became board certified in internal medicine and cardiology. Dr. Jeresaty served as the first Cardiology Chief and maintained that distinction for 35 years. He was also the first medical director of Hoffman Heart and Vascular Institute of Connecticut at Saint Francis. In 1965, he established a cardiology symposium, and in 1995 it was named in his honor. Today it is the longest running symposium in the United States; going on its 55th year. He held many appointments, was a member of several professional societies, wrote more than 60

articles and won numerous awards including the Saint Francis Spirit Award and Distinguished Physician Award.

In addition, Dr. Jeresaty and his late wife Cathie were generous with their time and their support of philanthropy efforts and volunteer opportunities at Saint Francis. They have invested in the future of Saint Francis by joining the Valencia Society. And they also found time to travel, raise five children and enjoy priceless moments with their eight grandchildren.

Dr. Surendra Chawla

Dr. Surendra Chawla arrived at Saint Francis two decades after Dr. Jeresaty in 1976. In his 42 years he performed more than 9,000 cardiac surgeries. This represents more than 200 a year. In 1999 he was named surgical co-director of Hoffman Heart and Vascular Institute of Connecticut and helped create the busiest cardiac surgery program in New England. His best surgical memories include performing successful open heart surgery on the secretary of the President of India and Connecticut Governor William O'Neill. He retired from active clinical practice in January 2018 but has continued with his passion for research in the Pathology department at Saint Francis.

He and his wife, Ranjana, have always believed in philanthropy and volunteering at the work place. Ranjana is a member of the Saint Francis Auxiliary; they have both served on hospital boards and their support has created the Chawla Auditorium, Vidya Seth Lifelong Learning Center, Chawla Cardiac Surgery Center and this year, a conference room in the CICU dedicated to the nurses and physician assistants working on that floor.
